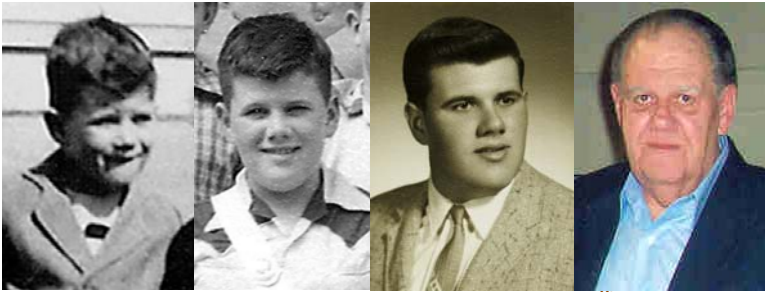


# Sylvan Schwegman
